- You will always have someone to talk to about your future plans, for example, your form tutor or the careers team at Woodfield School.
- Whichever year group you are in, you can request a meeting to talk through your ideas for the future with a fully-qualified, impartial careers adviser. If the careers adviser is not in school, you can speak to the Head of Sixth form.
- Your parents can be invited to attend these meetings too.
- Careers advice can be given during PLP days and Annual Reviews also.
